Respite Center

- Collaborative effort among agencies addressing mental and physical health issues that bring them to the attention of law enforcement
- Currently providing a 12 hour drop off period for individuals committing Criminal Trespass or encountered during a trespass report
- Homeward Bound offers a 16 bed short-term program with wrap-around services to assess and triage to appropriate care



Funding

- Overarching Concepts
 - Reduce Jail Population Reduce # of Mentally III Persons Incarcerated
 - Address Mental Health/Addiction problems reducing recidivism
- Funding to develop the program was sought by the Dallas County District Attorney's Office from DOJ, Bureau of Justice Assistance
- The North Texas Behavioral Health Authority (LBHA) committed SB292 funding to support MH housing and treatment
- Dallas County funded renovation of 7500 sq ft space to accommodate medical clinic, behavioral health offices and 16 residential beds



Intake Process

• Law Enforcement Officer arrives with detainee and presents potential client for admission. Officer completes short form identifying subject and description of encounter. Officer returns to service in 15 minutes



• Homeward Bound and NTBHA staff engage individual to determine appropriateness for admission.



Services Available

- Homeward Bound provides Professional and Peer engagement along with residential care – 24-hour staffing, meals, transportation
- NTBHA provides mental health screening, connections to community mental health providers and supported housing as well as funding Homeward Bound's residential services
- Parkland Hospital HOMES program provides onsite health screenings and primary care attention to client health needs



Dallas Deflects

- Alternative to Jail 15 minute drop off for officers
- Community based diversion program Homeward Bound
- Links clients to treatment and services in the community
- Housed at Homeward Bound
- Opened August 2022



Dallas Deflects by the Numbers

Over 230 individuals brought to the Center

• Dallas Police 70%, DART transit 15%

• 8% identify at Veterans

Black households make up 60% of the homeless population.




Dallas Deflects Intakes

- Officers' role will be only 1) determine eligibility 2) transport & 3) enroll individual in the facility
- Officers are then free to return to service Goal is 15-minute turnaround




Who can go to Deflection Center?

- Criminal Trespass Class B
- Must be at least 18 years old
- No outstanding warrants
- The Deflection Center WILL take an individual with a Class C warrant
 - However, each LEA will set its own policy regarding Class C warrants
- Not a registered sex offender
- Does not meet the criteria for APOWW



APPOW

- If individual decompensates to meet level for APPOW follow standard APPOW protocol
- Transport individual to nearest inpatient health facility
