



#### Regional Probation/Parole Map




(as of October 2023)

### Importance of Diversion

- Trauma Response
  - Trauma in utero
  - Abuse/Neglect
- Neurodivergence
  - Sensory needs
  - Underdeveloped skill
  - Ability/Expectation discrepancy



#### **Regionalization Overview**

- In 2015, the 84<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature instructed TJJD to develop and adopt a regionalization plan.
- August 2015 the Regionalization Task Force was established.
- Regionalization Division created March 1, 2016.
- Initial targets set for diversions: 30 diversions in 2016, 150 diversions in 2017, 2018, and 2019.
- Fiscal year 2020, 2021, 2022 220
- Contributing documents: Closer to Home Report, Improving Outcomes in the Texas Juvenile Justice System, and Core Principles for Reducing Recidivism and Improving Other Outcomes for Youth in the Juvenile Justice System.

### What youth are appropriate for diversion?



### **Changes to RDA Priority Population**

- The initial target population of youth appropriate for diversion under the RDA Program
  grant includes all youth who are eligible, and under consideration, for commitment to TJJD.
- Youth in the *priority* population:
  - ✓ Younger offenders (those between the ages of 10-14);
  - ✓ Youth with a serious mental illness;
  - ✓ Youth with a developmental or intellectual disability;
  - ✓ Youth with only non-violent offenses;
  - ✓ Youth with low- to moderate- risk to reoffend levels;
  - ✓ Youth who scored "Clear Concern" on the CSE-IT;
  - ✓ Youth who have four or more adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) or any of the synergistic pairs of ACEs;
  - √ Youth who are/will be parenting;
  - √ Female youth with a specialized treatment need; and/or
  - ✓ Older youth in need of vocational or educational services.

# What Are We Looking For When We Staff an Application?

- Have department interventions been appropriate? In order to qualify,
  the juvenile probation department must demonstrate a prior effort to
  provide appropriate intervention with priority given to the treatment
  needs of the youth. Intervention should be commensurate with county
  resources.
- As provided by the department and reviewed by the assigned administrator - can the identified treatment needs be met at the recommended facility?
- If outside the region why?
- Is the recommended length of stay and cost per day appropriate?

#### **Facility Handbook**



#### The Facility Handbook:

- has been developed to assist the probation field in finding appropriate residential treatment programs for identified youth;
- includes residential treatment programs that have been used by departments through the Regional Diversion Alternatives Program (RDA); and
- is divided three ways: by region, by available specialized treatment, and by special populations.
