

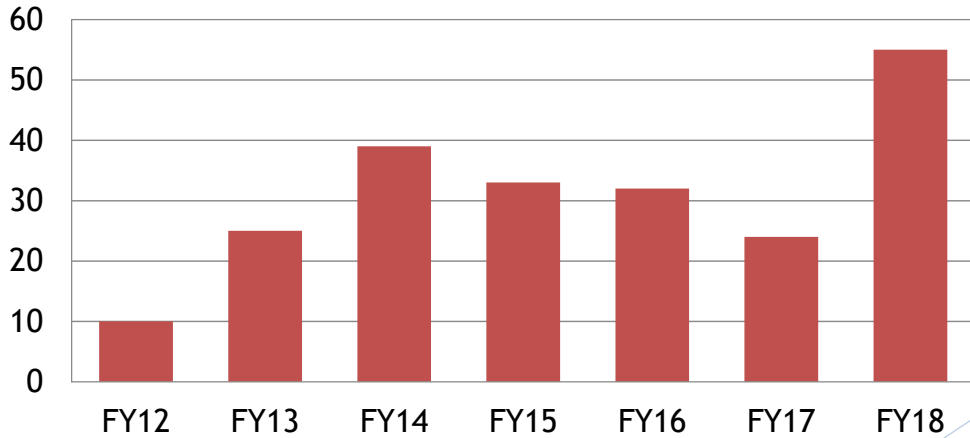

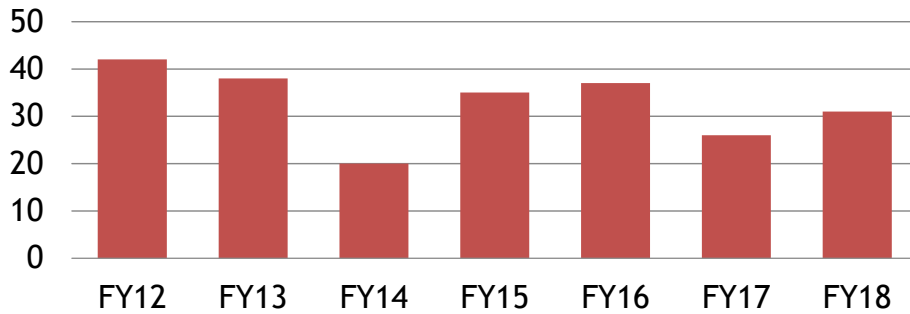
1. Outpatient

Number of Inmates Transferred to State Hospital

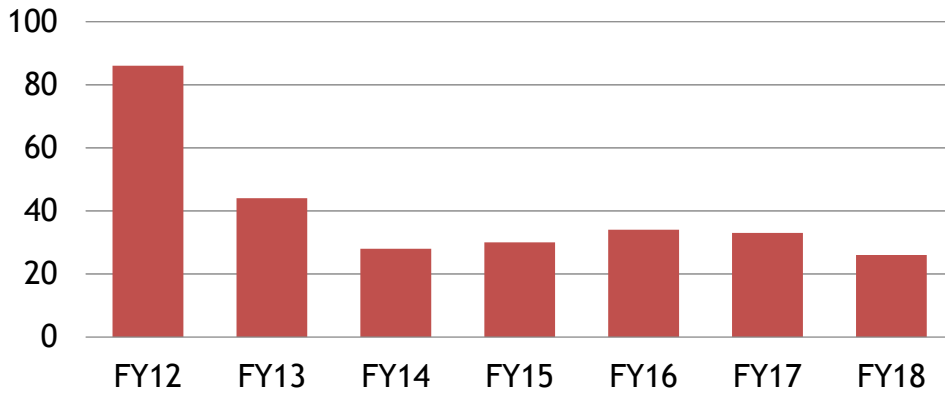


The number of inmates transferred to the State hospital has continued to rise annually.

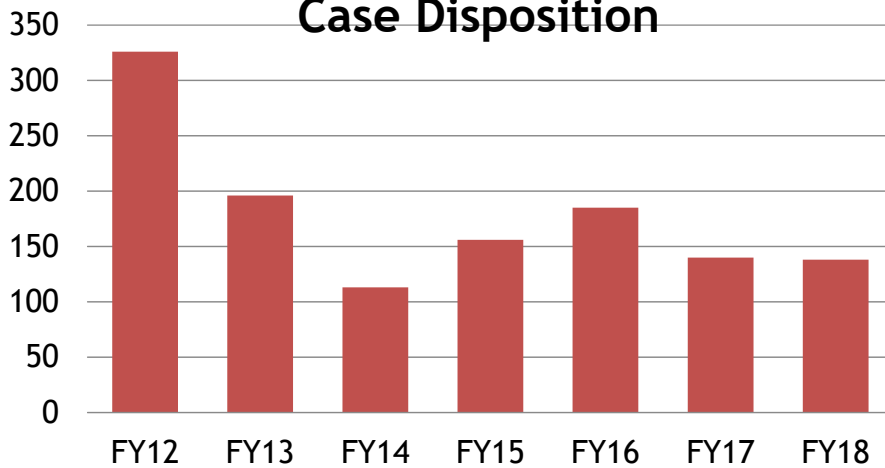
Average Jail Days - Mental Commitment to Transport to State Hospital



Average Jail Days - Return from State Hospital to Case Disposition

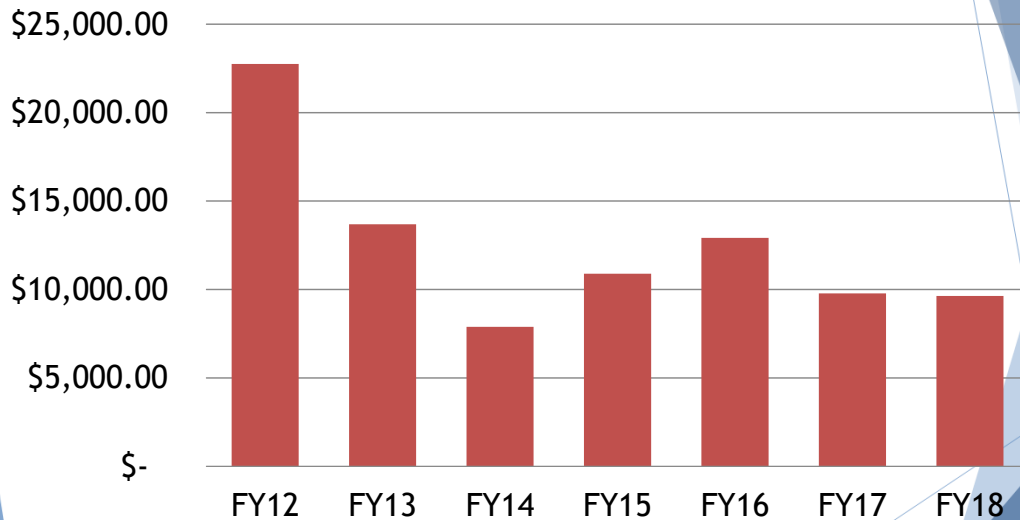


Average Jail Days - Arrest to Case Disposition



By changing the way we train attorneys and handle competency cases, Collin County has continued to decrease the Average days in custody for Competency Cases.

Cost Savings

- Where Can the Cost be Saved
 - Recognition of Competency Issues
 - Prompt Filings for Exams
 - Prompt Dissemination of Information
 - Prompt Hearing on Receipt of Report
 - Prompt Distribution of Orders
 - Prompt Return of Inmates/Hearing after Restoration
 - Ongoing Investigation/Preparation of the Case
 - No Deterioration and Return to Incompetent State Due to Delay
 - Restoration Prior to Transport

System Change

Establish One Point of Contact (POC) for Competency Cases

- Provide hospitals notice of the POC, email and fax; establish all hospital notices/reports to route through POC
- All orders route through POC
- All hearings coordinated and set through POC

Judicial Commitment

- Hearings within 3 days of return
- Bench Warrant issued for return within 3 days of request
- Attorneys are to be prepared to handle cases, must appear before the court for resets

Jail Commitment

- Transport within 3 days of request
- Medication Administration-psychiatric stabilization, court ordered meds post return

Jail/DA/Defense

- Weekly team medical meetings to:
 - Identify competency concerns
 - Identify medication needs/issues
 - Identify possible dismissals or civil cases
