## COMMUNITY PROVIDER TRAINING

OPRC offers Reentry Employment Specialist training on a quarterly basis. RES is designed for those who work, with justice involved individuals in securing and retaining employment. Specifically targeting those who work in prisons, jails, probation, parole, Career Resource Centers, Government Agencies and Faith based and Community Organizations, the curriculum is designed to improve employment outcomes for persons with criminal histories through strategies of enhanced collaboration, employment assessment, and job development. Participants must attend all times and days specified to receive a certificate of completion and will receive the RES Workbook and other reentry resources.
