Developing OCR and JBCR Programs in Harris County

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A Full Continuum of Competency Restoration Services in Harris County



- State Hospital
- UT Health- Harris County Psychiatric Center
 - Can step-down into outpatient competency restoration, if appropriate
- Jail Based Competency Restoration
 - Accepts individuals on the Maximum Security Unit waitlist
 - Can step-down into outpatient competency restoration if appropriate
- Outpatient Competency Restoration
 - Services delivered in one location provided by UT Health
 - Can step-up into JBCR or HCPC depending on patient need



Outpatient Competency Restoration



FY 2022 Data

• Restoration Rate: 69%

Average Length of Stay: 61 days

• Total Beds: 16

• Resident: 54%

• Commuter: 46%

• Jail: 49%

• Bond: 51%

Residential Component

 Participants can stay on-site or live in the community with court approval

Safeguards

- Rigorous assessment process
- The Harris Center funds GPS ankle monitors for patients transitioning from jail



Jail Based Competency Restoration

• Restoration Rate: 93%

Average Length of Stay: 55 days

• Total Beds: 20

• MSU: 52%

• Felony: 83%

• Misdemeanors: 17%

- Collaboration with Community Partners
 - Creating a workflow and including all parties
 - Including 17.032 Charges

Key Points

- One centralized Competency Restoration Docket
- Weekly court staffings

Lessons Learned

- Assessment orders allow for gatekeeping and quality control
- Addressing Misdemeanors and timeout issues
- JBCR to OCR Stepdown (if appropriate)
- Less than 1% of completed JBCR patients required their original MSU bed



JBCR Highlights



- May 2020- Funding for the JBCR Program Provided by Texas Health & Human Services Commission (HHSC)
- October 2021- The JBCR Mentorship Program was developed
- December 2021- The JBCR MD Virtual Cohort had its first meeting
- **December 2021** The JBCR Program underwent an HHSC State Audit and passed with a score of 100%, citing no program deficiencies
- January 2022- Through collaboration, the Harris County JBCR Program assisted four other counties or jails with JBCR program development and start-up
- April 2022- Implementation of Client-Attorney Structured Engagement (CASE)
 virtual pilot program
- July 2022- Submitted the JBCR Program for an American Psychiatric Association Award
- October 2022- Presented at the National Commission on Correctional Health Care's (NCCHC) Annual Conference in Las Vegas, NV
