

WHAT IS AOT?




Assisted Outpatient Treatment is a tool in the toolbox for civil courts and mental health systems to work collaboratively to help individuals with serious mental illness (SMI) caught in a cycle of repeat hospitalizations, homelessness and incarcerations.

Individuals who benefit have a history of inconsistent engagement with treatment often due to diminished awareness of the need for treatment.



Who's a Good Candidate




- Meets criteria under the law
- Is 18 years old or older
- Diagnosed with SMI
- Unlikely to survive safely in the community without supervision
- History of lack of compliance with treatment
- Unlikely to voluntarily participate in treatment
- Treatment needed to prevent relapse or deterioration



PARTICIPANT CONSIDERATIONS

- Has a significant intellectual deficit
- Has a primary substance use disorder
- Needed treatment is not available in the community
- Person's location is unknown
- Enjoys being hospitalized
- Pending criminal charge makes person ineligible for MH court



Black Robe Effect

Judge respected as symbol of authority

Black robe effect works on treatment system too!



Judge and treatment téam act as motivators

WHAT IS AOT

- No contempt of court
- No forcibly administered meds
- No jail or fines
