

Current Landscape at Terrell State Hospital

- High influx of patients from emergency detentions and walk-ins.
- 46 beds typically occupied by jail transfers are currently unavailable due to high demand.



In-Jail Evaluations and Competency Programs

- Many patients respond well to medications provided in jail.
- Importance of implementing in-jail evaluations and competence programs.



Ethical Dilemmas Faced by Physicians




- Ethical concerns about discharging patients back to jail once deemed competent.
- The potential need for extended stays to explore and manage psychosis.

Variability in Competency Evaluations

- Large variation in what evaluators across institutions consider "incompetent"
- Discrepancies create inconsistencies in patient outcomes.

Competency Restoration Program variability across Texas



- Differences in frequency and intensity of competency classes among state hospitals.
- Terrell State Hospitals unique approach to daily competency training.

Challenges in Competency Restoration: A Case Study

Overcrowding and Resources Allocation at Terrell State Hospital

- Terrell State Hospital admits over 120 patients monthly, whereas Austin admits only 8 on a scheduled basis
- Presenting these statistics to the judiciary to advocate for better resource distribution.
